Fall Book Sale Breaks Records!

By now you may have heard that our recent book sale was a huge success due to our fantastic volunteers and community! We raised \$16,639, shattering our Spring record by over \$2,600. Volunteers work year-round to screen donated books and box them for storage. We are very fortunate to have Cheshire's Ace Van Lines donate warehouse space to store the filled boxes and then deliver them on our day of setup. During our three-day preparation, 70 volunteers unboxed and organized approximately 18,000 books and 4,000 digital media. A special thank you to members of the High School's Interact Club and the MechaRams Robotics Club, Rotarians and Friends members who worked so hard.

During the sale, over 90 time slots were staffed by Friends members who restocked tables and cashed out customers. Fun fact: Over 30% of sales were paid for by credit cards!

Lots of people ask what happened to the unsold books! We invite non-profit organizations (like Read to Grow, American Friends of Kenya, etc.) to take any left-over books on the Monday after the sale. Goodwill took the remaining books in 10 big bins.

With the wonderful support of our volunteers and community, the Friends can continue funding dynamic programs at our vibrant library.

Winter is a busy time of year for library programs sponsored by the Friends! From January through March, library patrons can attend six Sunday concerts, including another concert featuring Rhonda Denet and her trio, who were the most popular group we had last year.

Our next Family After-hours program sponsored by the Friends is a Hula Hoop Dance party on January 24.

St Patrick's Day is always a favorite holiday and we are celebrating it with two events, a concert of traditional Irish music with Deirdre McMorrow and Paul Pender on Sunday March 15 and a talk on March 10 on the Ogham Alphabet, which is the earliest written form of primitive Irish and the oldest of the Gaelic languages.
