## • Where can I find more information on my seeds?

 The large binder near the seed library drawers contains the original packaging for each type of seed we received this year. Please do not remove these packages. You may write down any information you find pertinent using the provided paper and pen, or you can take a picture with your phone, etc.

#### Where did you get the seeds?

These packets are from seed companies that either sent us the seeds for free or (more commonly) at a steeply discounted rate. The Friends of the Library provided the funds for what you see here. You can see which companies' seeds are in our library on the flyer over on the table holding the Seed Library drawers.

## What, they just give them to you?

 They generally send last year's leftover stock. These are still "good" and have not expired due to age, although you might see slightly lower germination rates than brand new packages.

# Do I need to check them out, bring the packaging back, etc?

All we ask is that you fill out the log giving us an idea of how many packages you took and which types. You don't have to check anything out or bring anything back, although we are happy to take donations if you find you have extra seeds lying around!

## Why can I only take five?

 We want every person who wants free seeds to get some, and that means we have to share.

### Why do I have to fill out the log when I take seeds?

 Libraries love to keep statistics, in large part so that we can fine-tune our collections and better serve our patrons in the future!

#### Will you restock?

 We'll be restocking throughout spring 2024, putting out new packets as they are ready.

#### Can I request certain types of seeds?

 Since we're relying on donated seeds, we get what the seed companies are willing to send us and cannot make specific requests.

#### • Can I donate seeds?

Yes! We can accept donated seed that has been harvested within the last two
years and is clearly labeled on the packaging. Please bring any donations to the
Adult Services desk on the lower level of the library.
